The 2011 neonatal resuscitation guidelines now recommend using room air or 21% oxygen for PPV. (Before 2011, 100% oxygen was recommended.) Stop PPV when the baby is breathing on his or her own and the heart rate is greater than 100 beats/minute. If the baby needs PPV beyond 5 minutes of life, attach an oxygen saturation monitor to the right wrist by placing the probe on the baby before ...

For the UVC securement, in the 7th edition of the Textbook of Neonatal Resuscitation a combination of suturing and taping of the UVC, or, alternatively, the use of a clear adhesive dressing is recommended.
